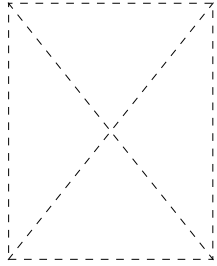

The leaders will meet regularly under the chairmanship of Andrew Oliver (Tel: 255941) to coordinate and plan major developments. Members of each team will meet as required to manage the displays in their own areas. We shall also hold two general meetings in the year and our usual summer barbecue and Christmas lunch.

We hope this system make it easier for helpers to

join us and to feel closer to our work without burdening them with too much management.

Our new chairman, Andrew Oliver, is also chairman of our Parish Council's Village Maintenance sub-committee which has 2 Nafferton in Bloom members co-opted to it. This helps bring the greater resources and authority closer to Nafferton in Bloom's work. For example we hope to be able to enter the Yorkshire in Bloom competition again in 2012. Another major task for the village is the clean up of our Mere. Also we should like to commemorate the Jubilee next year, though we are rather short of practical ideas.

## NEW HISTORY OF NAFFERTON IN PREPARATION

With the support and encouragement of the Parochial Church Council and others, historian and Nafferton resident Dr Stephen Harrison is preparing a new book on the history of the parish. This will be a comprehensive, fully illustrated account, providing the first detailed and systematically researched history of the village and parish from prehistoric times to the present day. Much information has already been gathered, but Stephen would be very interested to hear from anyone who may have photographs and details about more recent times in Nafferton, as well as documentation relating to the village's older properties, farms, and families. Any such material will only be used with permission and will, of course, be fully acknowledged. He can be contacted via the village website.

It is hoped to have the book published in time for Christmas 2012. Proceeds from the sale of the book will be donated to All Saints' Church, Nafferton.
