#### NAFFERTON IN BLOOM—THE FIRST 10 YEARS AWARDS

Formed by a small group of local residents, Nafferton in Bloom first entered "Yorkshire in Bloom" in the large village class in 1989 and in that first year were rewarded with a Certificate of Merit. Subsequently, the group has gone on to consistently win various awards. Below is a list of the achievements of the first 10 years.

1989-94	Certificate of Merit
1995	3rd place in East Riding large village class and 3rd place in the Audrey Hartley Memorial awards for a war memorial floral display
1996	Trophy winner Summer Displays East Riding large village class. 2nd place in the Audrey Hartley Memorial awards for a war memorial floral display
1997	2nd place awarded for both spring and summer displays. 2nd place Audrey Hartley Memorial awards for a war memorial floral display
1998	Trophy winner East Riding large village class for spring and summer displays.
1999	2nd place East Riding large village class for spring and summer displays.

The group has continued to flourish from that date and a list of awards 2000-2012 will be published when the current year's results are announced in September (*See above article*). All these awards have been achieved by volunteers giving their time and skills to the Nafferton in Bloom group, with the participation of local businesses and residents producing fine displays. Everyone has made a difference and more help is always needed. Just imagine what a different atmosphere the village would have if all the floral displays did not exist, it would be rather dismal!
