Nafferton Primary School - Bags2school

We are pleased to announce that the school has organised a textile collection with Bag2School in order to help raise funds for the school.



Bag2School are the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 they have now paid out over £16 million. As well as raising vitally needed funds for our school, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 1,081,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, bags, soft toys, curtains and bedding (not duvets or pillows). We will receive £500 per tonne or £0.50/kg which will be a great boost for our fundraising. In addition it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

Donation bags are being given to each pupil in school but if you need a bag to donate items please call in to the school office. Bag2School will be collecting from our school on Friday 6th October at 9. 00 a.m. Please bring your bag (or bags!) to the front playground and help us have a really good collection. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME AND THE SAFE AND SOUND GRANT

The Neighbourhood Watch Scheme is about local people working together to create a safe, attractive, friendly place to live where crime is less likely to occur and people are less likely to turn to anti-social behaviour. It is about neighbours looking out for each other and making sure that no one needs to feel alone, scared or vulnerable in the place that they live. The main purpose is to prevent crime by taking steps to make Nafferton a safer place to live. This includes providing information and advice on how to make your home more secure as well as being the eyes and ears of the Police in the area. Members can receive and pass on information to each other, the police and ERYC where appropriate. Groups can also get involved with optional activities such as Crime prevention training, Fire safety awareness, Emergency planning, Activities to improve local environment and Crime resilience initiatives.

How does it work?

Each group is run by its own community. Some groups meet on a regular basis, others via email and/or newsletter and meet when needed. The council will help get the group off the ground and provide you with information and advice on an ongoing basis. Neighbourhood Watch provides a communication route to the Police and ERYC for you to pass on your collective knowledge which can then be used to combat crime and help shape how services are delivered.

What can we do?

We only have 3 streets signed up to NW in Nafferton - Ward Lea, St Quintins Field, and Beech Grove - and we would like to see more. The Parish Council are also joining so we will get all the communications going forward.

The Safe and Sound Grant

This is a grant to help minimise the fear of crime by providing additional home security measures to enable residents to feel safe in their home.

To qualify for assistance applicants must be:

- * Aged over 60 or disabled
- A homeowner or private sector tenant/Housing Association tenant
- Everyone living in the property must not have a bank balance of over £5000 when added together

How can it help?

There will be free home security assessment and home security equipment can be fitted.

CCTV

We have appointed GTek Systems of Kilham to undertake the works for the Playground CCTV and the Recreation Club CCTV. Work should be started shortly and completed in October.

DOG FOULING

The issue of dog fouling remains an issue so please find information and contact numbers from the Dog Warden Section:

ERYC have found random patrols to be ineffectual. By asking complainants for a more information up front the dog warden team is using an intelligence led approach, which is increasing success rates with fixed penalty notices.

For examples if a member of the public can tell the dog warden that 'a man in a red fleece walks a black Labrador on the playing field every morning at 7.30 am and never cleans up", we can make sure that dog warden is at the right time in the right pace looking for the right person.

TREES AND LANDSCAPE

ERYC would like to remind parishioners whose garden boundaries are adjacent to the boundary of the village conservation area, that should there be a need or intention to cut back trees which may encroach onto their property then it is a requirement to give the local authority 6 weeks notice before the works are carried out (211 notice). Please ensure any items placed in the donation bins around the village are pushed fully into the receptacle and if it is clearly full please do not leave bags at the side of the bin but return after it has been emptied.

Nafferton Against Fracking

Fracking is starting in Yorkshire!

Now the holiday season is over, and with it the calming of traffic around Flamingo Land, Third Energy are turning their full attention to developing their well pad in Kirby Misperton (less than a mile from the park, and only 1½ hour's drive from Nafferton). Adjacent to their existing conventional gas well, they have prepared another pad (KM8) and drilled another well in anticipation of test fracking it in the near future. This will be the first frack in the UK since Cuadrilla caused two small earthquakes in Blackpool in 2011. Consequently, fracking was 'put on hold', until now!

What fracking will do:

The villages south of KM8 and Kirby Misperton itself should expect a sharp increase in HGV movements (where before there were next to none) as heavy machinery is moved in to make ready the well for fracking. These movements will pale into insignificance once fracking begins as thousands of lorry journeys are required to service a pad. The pad operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The process of fracking requires millions of gallons of fresh water and thousands of tonnes of sand. Millions of gallons of contaminated waste water will need to be removed to treatment works many miles away.

And that's not all!

What happens then is unclear. It isn't actually possible to treat all the contaminants in the waste yet. To save money in the future, the oil/gas companies will look to reinject the untreated waste back into the earth, a process that is causing hundreds of earthquakes in the USA.

Worried?

When we can, members of our group will join with the locals and others sympathetic to the cause to protest against fracking at KM8. The more people gathered, the more people showing their opposition, the greater chance of stopping it. If we can stop it there, there is less chance it will happen here. What about our area?

Cuadrilla own the license to explore for gas in our area. If you see any unusual vehicles or activity anywhere please contact as above. Planning permission is not required to carry out seismic surveys, a procedure required to see what's underground. The trucks could appear anywhere.

We need them to know they are not welcome at as early a stage as possible. Please contact us by phone or by email (above) if you see anything.
