So, this year, to commemorate 100 years since the end of World War One, during the Autumn Term Nafferton Primary School will be partaking in a WW1 themed topic to remember this part of significant British history. Our school will be going 'back in time' to 1914 and the corridors and grounds will be transformed into the Edwardian era.

As part of this topic we have several exciting projects planned and we would like to involve the community. We are hoping to create a peace garden in our school grounds to commemorate the fallen soldiers from our local area. This is a large project and at the moment we have limited resources so any help or donations such as old paving stones, pots and flowers would be greatly appreciated.

In school we have a central cabinet to display any WW1 artefacts. We would be very grateful if you would like to loan the school any artefacts for this topic and we can assure you that these will be stored in a secure place. We pride ourselves on providing our children with a high quality learning environment and contributions as such will provide them with rich experiences.

During November we will also be holding our Remembrance Service and we are working closely with the Parish Church. We are hoping to open this to the public as well as our school so you can view the work which we have been doing over the first half term.
