## Nafferton Methodist church refurbishment

You may have read about this in the Driffield and Wolds Weekly or came to our meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> September. This is an update for those residents who are interested and could not come to the meeting. As I write this, there are still a few days to go before this meeting for the community so I will probably be repeating myself for those who attended, sorry about that!

Nafferton Methodist church is preparing for a major re-organisation of our internal space to increase the amount of space available to the community. We are creating an additional room with flexible walls so that the existing community room, the new room and the worship area can all be used in various configurations to match the sizes needed for any village purpose. Our entrance to the building is also being modified to be more accessible and we are installing a lift in the front lobby for those less able to use the normal entrance, and altering the level of the floor. As anyone who has used the building knows, the Methodist church, being an old building, can get very cold. The final aim of our changes if to upgrade the heating so that we have a warm building for all.

We are very aware of the environmental impact of warming such a large building, so we are installing solar panels on the rooves and a new environmentally friendly heating system.

These changes will require the building to be closed for about 8-9 months and we will be looking for alternative accommodation during the period when the church is a building site so there is as little disruption to everyone currently using the building. I will be able to tell you more about that at a later date.

We have formed a project team to look after all the things we need to do to complete our changes successfully so if you would like to get involved, please let me know and you will be more than welcome to be a part of our team. You can get involved for as little or as much time as you are able to give us and I will find a role that will match your skills, knowledge, and availability, even if it is just an hour here and there.

The Parish Council meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm in The Clubhouse at The Recreation Club – these meetings are public and open for anyone to attend.

<u>The Play Area</u> – Various items of equipment have either been repaired or are in the process of being repaired. Some funding will be available from the new build on Westend Falls for a small amount of new equipment in the Play Area a village consultation will take place in the near future to determine which equipment would best suit the area.

<u>The Mere</u> – Any routine maintenance required at the Mere will be carried out during the winter months. It has been noticed that some ducks are again sleeping in the road on the corner of Coppergate and we would ask motorists to be aware of this and take care.

The problem with pollution entering the Mere continues if you notice any items of pollution in the Mere please contact YW or the Parish Council immediately

<u>Village Maintenance -</u> The busy grasscutting season is coming to an end for Ross but there are still various items of autumn/winter work to keep him busy

<u>Dog Fouling</u> – Please be a responsible dog owner and carry a bag at all times to collect, take home and bin any excrement from your dog.

The Parish Council have to follow the guidelines as set out by ERYC and details are available on the ERYC web site for reporting any dog fouling in the Parish

At the last Parish Council some examples of 'Slow Down' signs produced by the pupils of Nafferton School were circulated and with funding from Feoffee it was agreed that approximately 12 signs will be erected by ERYC around the village.
