The Parish Council meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm at The Recreation Club – these meetings are public and open for anyone to attend.

# <u>Jubilee Park</u>

Even though we have had a particularly damp summer the playground has been enjoyed by many over the school holidays. The new signs have been put up and look great with the added splash of colour.

# <u>The Mere</u>

Investing in The Mere - The Mere is a valuable part of the natural environment for the village. It is often a focal point for many events in the village. To ensure it

remains this way the Parish Council is looking into ways in which it can improve the area not just for now but to secure it for future generations to enjoy.

We are commissioning a report into how we increase the biodiversity, ecology, wildlife habitat and health of the water. This will be a long-term project, it should however give guidance on short-, medium- and long-term development of The Mere.

Along with the report, the Parish Council are commissioning a new gate to go across the end of the horse wash. This will match the existing railings and will not only provide an additional level of safety but will add a new look to the area.

Please take care around the area of Coppergate, ducks may be sleeping on the highway.

If you notice any items of pollution in the Mere please contact Yorkshire Water or the Parish Council immediately.

#### The Nunings

Over the winter months the Parish Council will be planting a low maintenance, slow growing low native hedge around the community green space on The Nunings. This will enhance the area by making it safer for those making use of it, increase wildlife habitat and improve the environment for the residents. There will be a chance for local residents to get involved in how the improvements will be implemented before any plans are finalised. There will also be a community planting day when the plants arrive so get your spades ready!

East Riding of Yorkshire Council have also been asked to provide an additional litter bin in the area.

#### The Telephone Kiosk Station Road

The Parish Council are looking into moving this phone box to Jubilee Gardens. This is being considered due to the success of the library.
