NAFFERTON NEWS

NAFFERTON PARISH COUNCIL

New Councillor - We're very pleased to welcome Cathy Milan back to the Parish Council. Cathy has spent many years serving our community, and we're delighted she's chosen to re-join us. Jubilee Playground Fence Replacement - The fence at the back of Eastlands (by the playground) will shortly be replaced. Please help us keep the playground tidy and safe by encouraging children to use the bins provided.

- Willow Tree & Mere Maintenance At the end of October, work will take place on the willow tree on Mere Island:
- The broken bough will be removed (and kept as habitat piles on the island).
- The crown will be lifted 2–3 metres above the waterline.
- In addition, the mere levels will be lowered to allow neighbouring households to carry out any required maintenance. Neighbouring properties will be notified of the exact date two weeks in advance.

Humberside Police - Operation Snap



Did you know you can submit video evidence of driving offences that you or members of the public have witnessed? Operation Snap is a secure online platform, and its purpose is to improve road safety and to prosecute those that place others at risk.

<u>What can you report? - Op Snap is for traffic offences only. It is not for submitting footage of road traffic collisions or any other offences. The offences we can investigate through Op Snap include:</u>

- dangerous driving
- driving without due care and attention
- careless driving
- using a mobile phone handheld whilst driving
- not wearing a seat belt
- ignoring a red traffic light
- disregarding solid white lines
- close passes of cyclists
- zigzag lines (outside school)
- zigzag lines (pedestrian crossing)

Operation Snap has one desired outcome: making our roads safer.

SKERNE AND WANSFORD NEWS

ST MARY'S CHURCH, WANSFORD

<u>Thanks</u> - Once again thanks go to all the people who are supporting St Mary's in so many ways – the gift of a disabled ramp, organising or attending fundraising, donating money and giving time to clean the church.

Lychgate gates - Many will have noticed that the gates to the lychgate, which are substantially rotten, have been removed. This is to enable a York Diocese church architect to ascertain how much of the original woodwork can be salvaged in a repair. Originally, the parochial church council hoped to replace the gates with exact replicas but permission to do so was denied by the York Diocese Advisory Committee (DAC), as the DAC, which believed that the gates' design was very rare in the UK, felt that they could be repaired. An exact estimate of the repair cost was not available when the newsletter went to press as the architect's inspection report was still awaited. However, the Lissett Wind Farm Community Fund has supported the project with a direct donation of £3,332, which is expected to go a long way toward the cost of the gates' refurbishment.

Guttering - Handyman Ian Lamble (of ICL Bossman Services) has given the St Mary's gutters a long overdue clean out as well as painting the guttering, downpipes and eaves of St Mary's. Without all of your support essential maintenance work such as this would not have been possible.

Afternoon tea success – A well-attended garden party at Wansford Manor raised £1,615 for church funds. Thanks go to Soshana and Darren McKnight Hill for all their hard work in organising this very enjoyable event and successfully ordering perfect weather.

<u>Coffee morning</u> - The final figure raised at the coffee morning in July organised by Shirley Botterill was £450; thanks go to Shirley and all those who helped her in any way.

Skerne and Wansford parish is served by the Humber and Wolds Rural Community Council (HWRCC) bulk-buying oil co-operative; the minimum order is 500 litres and the HWRCC negotiates the best oil price from a range of suppliers. In August the price achieved was 47.27 per litre against the non-member price of 55.71p making a saving of £44.32 (inc VAT) on 500 litres. Membership costs £20 per year.
