Some of you may have seen on social media that we are planning to create a wall hanging to celebrate the amazing community we live in. We would like people of all ages, and genders, to join in by making a 15cm/6" square that represents themselves, a loved-one, a feature or an organisation in the Nafferton and surrounding villages area. Sewing can be very therapeutic and can have a calming effect. Take the time to create a lasting memorial for a loved one or something to represent yourself as a member of the community. If you don't have fabric, thread, or a needle etc we can help. finished squares should be dropped off at the Recreation Club post box on the wall. The fabric type is unimportant, but there does need to be at least a half inch clear border around the design so the squares can be joined together. That means the base fabric must measure at least 7". Please join in we have a few but need lots more. It would be lovely to have this as a bit of history in years to come for our children to show their children. Any design can be done anything at all.

The book is open for 2021 bookings at the Recreation Club and we hope the building is filled again every weekend with people and laughter. We really hope that next year we will be able to welcome you back to events at the Recreation club but until then we would like to wish you all a Happy Christmas and a happy healthy New year!

# All Saints' Church

An update of All Saints' Church - we completed our assessment of self-distancing and safety for all our Parishioners before we re-opened in July.

We are following the guidelines given by Church of England and the Government to open for Quiet Prayer on Sundays only from 9am until 10am. During October, we could open at 9am for Quiet Prayer and then 9.30am until 10am for a Said Service (No singing). We were fortunate to have our organist play a hymn for the Parishioners to listen to.

Rev Simon and his Ministry Team are on a Zoom service twice on a Sunday morning. Please contact Rev Simon for further details.

A Daily Hope phone line **0800 804 8044**, which is available 24 hours a day, has been set up for those who are unable to join online or attend Church Service during these restrictions. This offers music, prayers, and reflections as well as a full worship.

Our normal CHRISTMAS services - Carols by Candlelight, Crib Service, 10pm Holy Communion are **UNABLE** to go ahead this year due to restrictions on numbers on the premises, for your safety is our priority. **We are as disappointed as you.** 

We will however keep you all informed of any services we will be able to conduct by posters in both our Notice Boards, also in Driffield Wolds Weekly paper of the outcome of what the Government and Church of England say we can or cannot do.

The P C C of All Saints' would like to wish you all a very different Christmas that we will be all having this year.
