ST MARY'S CHURCH, WANSFORD

Carol singing - Carol singing around the village will take place on Tuesday December 17th starting at 6pm from the Lych gate. The 'choir' will first make its way to Pleasant Wood before returning along Nafferton and Driffield roads taking in The Square and Chapel Lane before finishing the evening at the Trout Inn, by kind permission of landlord Paul Anderson, where it will sing to the diners and drinkers. All are welcome to join in either at the start or anywhere enroute.

Lych gate –Moves are afoot to repair the Lych gate, which was damaged by the falling bough of a beech tree during Storm Lilian in late August. However, these things take time. A quote for the repair has been obtained which, at the time of going to press, was being considered by St Mary's insurers. In parallel the Parochial Church Council had to apply to the York diocese for a faculty in order to carry out the repairs and the outcome of this will not be known before mid-December at the earliest.

Beech tree logs – After the felling of the beech tree, which was diseased, by The Tree Walkers, members of the village community were invited to make donations to the tree felling cost in exchange for logs. To date this has raised £225; a further very generous donation of £500 towards the tree felling cost was also made.

Finances and fundraising - Following the unexpected £2,400 cost of felling the beech tree along with a £500 insurance excess, St Mary's, which, more or less held its own financially last year, looks on course to make a substantial loss the year ending January 2024. Should anyone wish to raise funds or support St Mary's in any way that would be most welcome; it is your church.



<u>The Mere</u> – Nafferton Mere is owned by Nafferton Parish Council and under no circumstances must anything go in or on The Mere without prior approval at a Parish Council Meeting. Planning permission has been granted to carryout the required work on the trees on the island, full planning to cover removal of the tree was requested only as a last resort. The Parish Council have instructed the specialist that has been arranged to carry out the work to perform as much minimal work as possible but if the tree is fully diseased and there is nothing that can be done to save it then it will have to be removed.

If this is the case the Parish Council will be obtaining a replacement Willow tree to be planted in its place on the island, as it is understood what an important part a tree of this type is to the view of The Mere but also to the wildlife that uses the tree for shelter and food.

Any routine maintenance required at the Mere will be carried out during the winter months. Please take care around the area of Coppergate as ducks may be sleeping on the highway.

If you notice any items of pollution in the Mere, please contact Yorkshire Water or the Parish Council immediately.

<u>Village Maintenance -</u> Village maintenance is always ongoing and you will still see Ross around the village carrying out some jobs.
