DRAINAGE & FLOODING ISSUES: Discussions are still ongoing at County Hall. The third meeting will take place in late February when it is hoped that "costings" will be put in place to further improve drainage in Nethergate, Westgate and the Station Road areas.

WINTER PREPARATIONS – RAIN: We would like to arrange to have sandbags available in the village but storing them is a problem. Please contact Councillor Lavis (272772) if you have any thoughts on this. If you have any reason to be concerned for your property, the Yorkshire Water emergency number is 08451 242424.

WINTER PREPARATIONS - SNOW & ICE: village now has a good supply of salt. Two new salt bins are now located on the corner of High Street/Orchard Close and at the junction of Howe Lane and Coppergate. Unfortunately, Highways Department regulations prevented the placing of a bin in Mill Chase. Steve Kirkwood is augmenting the spreading of grit carried out by ERYC. When salt bins are getting low please contact Councillor Lavis (chairman of the village maintenance team). DOG FOULING: this continues to be an issue in all areas of the village, and we must place responsibility on the owners and not the animals. It is unhealthy and dangerous to adults, children and other animals if owners do not pick up the mess created by their dogs. Over time the Parish Council has received recurring complaints from village residents, so in future we will pass on information received to the East Riding dog warden service for prosecution.

NOTICE BOARD AT THE MERE: During the weekend of 07 to 09 December the notice board was blown down in high winds. It is beyond repair.

We need to replace it but there are no plans at present about how to do this, and about how a replacement might be funded. If you have any suggestions for a way of replacing the notice board, please contact Beverley Pickering (272272).
