ONGOING ISSUES ... DOG FOULING...

It's not fair that conscientious dog owners who clear up their pets' mess are also seen to be offenders. Priestgate, Station Road and Middle Street are the areas worst affected by this antisocial behaviour. If you are prepared to report dog owners who refuse to clear up the mess left by their dogs, then inform a member of the Parish Council who in turn will pass on the name(s) of the offender(s) to ERYC Enforcement Officers. Alternatively, you can contact the Dog Warden Service on 01482 396301: to request removal of dog faeces from the street, call 01482 393939.

SNOW...

Please clear the snow from your own frontage, and check to see if your neighbours need help clearing theirs.

GRITTING...

ERYC is responsible for gritting the main roads through the village. The Parish Council is responsible for the following areas: the junction of Westgate and the school area; outside the Doctors' surgery; the bus stop; the Post Office, the Londis shop and the fish & chip shop.

DRAINS...

Please check that debris isn't blocking drains.


