### Nafferton Feoffees Charities Trust Scholarship Scheme 2015/16

Please see below details of the Nafferton Feoffees Scholarship Scheme, which is to be offered again this year (its 13th year), after its inaugural launch in 2003. This Scholarship aims to benefit potential higher education students commencing their studies next autumn. This exciting scheme is approved by the Charities' Commission and comes at a time when first year students are anxious about funding, not only the cost of their studies, but especially the increased fees and equipment costs. This year sees a substantial increase in the value of the award. Unlike many scholarship schemes these awards are for the duration of the course. State and Independent schools with likely students are again being circulated with details. Applications from eligible students from the ecclesiastical area of Nafferton and Wansford are invited, and they will be invited for an interview. Applicants <u>must</u> be resident in the ecclesiastical parish of Nafferton with Wansford, and intend to enter a first degree course at a UK University, or College. ### **Lissett Community Wind Farm Fund**

Lissett Airfield Wind Farm is owned and operated by Infinis, one of the country's largest renewable energy producers. Since the wind farm opened in 2010 the company have made a donation of £60,000 each year into a fund which can be spent on projects that provide 'Public Benefit' in East Wolds and Coastal Ward of the East Riding. Among other grants, the parish of Nafferton has benefitted from a substantial contribution towards the establishment of a computer club (The Branch) associated with the Mustard Seed community coffee shop at Nafferton Methodist church.

The fund panel expects to receive its next donation from Infinis in January 2015 and applications are invited from local charities, community groups, schools, parish councils and churches in the East Wolds and Coastal Ward of the East Riding of Yorkshire. The fund panel will consider funding requests up to a maximum £5,000 and would like to see evidence of the applying organisation's commitment to the project up to a value of 30% of the total project costs. Applications must be submitted before Monday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2015. ### POSTBAG

A concerned resident writes: "have villagers noticed that most of the post boxes in our village have collection times changed from the end of the day to early each morning. Can we do anything about it now that it is privately owned?"
