Work commenced at All Saints' Church

Nafferton starting on

Monday 11th January 2016 concerning the reorganising of the west end of the Church. The work entails the removal of pews, new paved flooring, installation of under floor heating and enhancing the font area and upgrading the present radiators.

This work will cause considerable disruption to weekly services and access to the Church. The work is estimated to take approximately 12 - 14 weeks. The contractor and the Health & Safety officer for the project WILL NOT ALLOW ACCESS TO THE CHURCH VIA THE PRESENT ENTRANCE, and therefore the PCC in conjunction with the Ministry Team have decided to move services to our sister Church in the benefice St Mary's Church Wansford, where we already hold joint services in the month.

This decision has been made in order to protect the health and safety of Parishioners, their comfort and welfare when worshipping.

NMC recently completed the transfer of our contracted passenger services across to a sister community transport charity, HART. NMC have, for some time, been considering how best to sustain the minibus services which are so valued by village residents. The tie up with HART offered an obvious solution which enables a very professional and established local organisation to continue to operate community transport services for the village.

I am happy to add here that the transfer of the white bus (at no charge to HART) took place on the first of January 2016 and that our excellent driver Coral is now employed by HART ensuring full continuity of services to Nafferton folk.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Coral Green and John Ogilvie for their fantastic work over the years.

I would also like to thank Sarah Sellar for her amazing commitment to the village during her time as our NMC Minibus Co-ordinator. She will get some well-earned rest although she is to continue as the contact point for those village groups who wish to use our smaller silver minibus which remains available for hire to village organisations.
