Parish Council News



Thank you very much to those PC members and volunteers that helped clean up the Mere on Sat 17th Dec, especially Simon Wildridge who's tractor made the job significantly easier going! The cleanup uncovered a number of unwanted items - old push bikes, scooters, car batteries, road signs and traffic cones to name a few! During the cleanup we noticed that there was some erosion to the wall on Priestgate and consequently we will be lowering the Mere again shortly to allow an Engineer to assess the damage and effect repairs as necessary. As we are sure you will agree the cleanup has made a great improvement to the aesthetics of the Mere, especially from the railings on Priestgate, so please help us to keep it looking as good by disposing of your rubbish appropriately.

Yorkshire Water have been working very hard to find the pipes and junctions that are causing the cross contamination in the Mere. It's a complicated network but they believe they are very close to resolving this and in the meantime have been placing hay bales and sandbags to catch any debris that inadvertently gets in. These are being regularly checked and replaced.

We have completed the annual sluice maintenance and adjusted the sluice boards to ensure most of the flow is drawn below the water line, this has significantly reduced the surface flow and therefore the likelihood of ducklings being drawn through the sluice is greatly reduced.

Thanks to some fabulous fundraising by the Nafferton Scarecrow Festival team we are now in possession of a defibrillator for the village. We are just reviewing the proposed alternative options for siting it , to ensure the best possible coverage and once decided will let everyone know.

We are awaiting a formal response from BT to our request to transfer the village Phone Boxes to PC ownership. Once confirmed we will look at options for use such as book drop, and area to post village notices.

New Build Update



Work has begun on dismantling the old changing rooms and our contractors have safely removed the asbestos that was found in the old floor tiles.

As advised in the last newsletter, the Rec is pedestrian access only currently, and will be until the end of March, as we construct the new access road and Rec car park, plus the additional residential parking spaces, as per the approved plans.

The main Rec Club building is still in use, with the toilet area being used as an interim changing area for our local sports teams when playing at home.

Our contractors, Stubbs, have letter dropped local residents to advise of planned construction vehicle routes, and we have photographed the area to ensure adequate delapse of the Eastlands area post construction completion.

We will minimize the construction disruption wherever possible, and updates will continue to be available from the monthly PC meeting and Rec meetings, and will appear in this newsletter.

Thanks in advance to everyone for their patience during the project - when it's completed we will have a superb facility available for our community to use for generations to come!

It was that strictness, however, that made it possible for us to compare the applications fairly. We have now held a first assessment panel and made contact with the successful applicants. They have to formally accept our offer and then we can begin to disperse the funds.

By the next Newsletter we should have more of a timeline for the actual closure of NMC almost 20 years after its inception to help Nafferton mark the new millennium. The support of the residents over this time has been exceptional.
