# CONGRATULATIONS TO NAFFERTON PARISH COUNCIL AND THE NAFFERTON FEOFEES TRUST

The Nafferton Newsletter is a bi-monthly independent village service that originated in its current form, believe it or not, in late 2001. In all those years since its formation, we don't recall an opening event to match the recent opening of our very new Nafferton Recreation Club and it is felt appropriate by the Co-ordinators and the Editors of the Newsletter that due accord should be made of that GREAT DAY.

The official opening took place on Saturday the 9th December 2017 with the added pleasure of beautiful sunshine and although it was maybe a bit chilly, villagers turned out in great numbers not to just witness the opening ceremony but throughout the day, to enjoy the opportunity of seeing what this super facility has to offer. There was also a marquee where many village organisations manned stalls of all descriptions and there were many other activities for villagers to enjoy.

However, at the opening ceremony, the chairperson of the Parish Council, Sue Tait, gave the gathering a brief insight into what the Parish Council had achieved over the past three years, none of which could have been possible without the substantial financial help of the Nafferton Feoffees Trust. Sue was delighted to welcome the chairman of the Feoffees Trust Dr Wigglesworth, who added further very useful background to the considerable support that the Feoffees Charity had given and in so doing he introduced Mrs Win. Cooper who back in 1973 was instrumental in launching the original "Play-Group" facility. This was a wonderful moment to witness, but particularly for the two of them, when they jointly cut the "tape" to announce the new

NAFFERTON RECREATION CLUB was officially "OPEN".

There was much to see and do throughout the day, but just to see the various sections within the main building was just marvelous, the under 5's section, the male and female sports changing rooms with showers etc, the main hall, meeting room and kitchen, all very practical and hopefully will be well used. Then outside in the marquee, village activities were well in evidence with the added benefit of being entertained with songs from Nafferton Primary School Choir, two sessions of very lively dancing by the LS School of Dance and finally two sessions of carols played for us by the East Riding Youth Brass Band. Very many thanks go out to all those who contributed in the marguee and particularly to Caroline Martinson who we believe organised this section of the day as well as the evening function which was a huge success.

A lot of people deserve a lot of thanks, and you all know who you all are, so to you all from the Nafferton Newsletter "VERY SPECIAL THANKS" yes, it was quite a day. #### NAFFERTON AGAINST FRACKING

Let's keep our village Frack Free in 2018

This year could be crucial in our campaign to keep Fracking out of our area! The government has already divided our region into areas and sold licenses to frack each area (PEDL areas, Petroleum Exploration and Development licenses). Nafferton is partly in area TA05 (owned by Cuadrilla) and partly in TA06b (owned by Ineos).

#### The threat of surveying

So far, we have seen no activity, but the next stage will be seismic surveys to gain geological information about the shale gas layers deep underground. You may see large unusual vehicles ("thumper trucks"), notices advising of testing, marking out and cable laying in fields, augering or drilling. We want to monitor what is happening so if you suspect any such activity let the group know (Peter Reed on 01377 257600 or email naffertonAF@gmail.com).

If you are a land owner, the testing company needs your permission. They may tell you they have the right to use your land and if you refuse they could go to court to argue their case. But please don't make it easy for them- we really want them to know that the community wants to be FRACK FREE!

### The threat to our farming

In fact our farmers are crucial to a frack free future but they are also a group who stand to lose a great deal if fracking goes ahead. The potential hazards from fracking include air, land, and water pollution. With a fracking well every couple of kilometres the image of our "local grown" produce will be tarnished to say the least. As a farmer, fracking would have implications for insurance not least because of potential liability after a well is decommissioned and the oil company long gone, especially since many oil companies are already showing signs of financial instability!

The threat is to us all

Fracking would affect all of us, from house prices, air and water quality, our health, the amount of heavy traffic, ground pollution (and most of us are gardeners), all for oil we do not need and which will worsen climate change. Many areas (including Hull) have declared themselves FRACK FREE - we are hoping we can do the same in Nafferton- what do you think?


