## NAFFERTON PARISH COUNCIL www.nafferton.net

The Parish Council meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm at The Recreation Club – these meetings are public and open for anyone to attend.

<u>Nafferton Recreation Club</u> – Warm Spaces at the Recreation Club has been a great success but there is always room for more – please support this great initiative if you are able.

<u>The Nafferton Community Support Group</u> is still available for anyone in need of assistance please contact them direct or the Parish Council in the strictest confidence.

<u>Jubilee Play Park</u> – The fence in the Play Area is now getting to the end of its days , hopefully this year we will be able to install new fencing – quotes are being requested to replace the fences

**Please note:** Under no circumstances at all are any dogs allowed in The Jubilee Play Park <u>except</u> for Assistance Dogs.

<u>The Mere</u> – Any routine maintenance required at the Mere will be carried out during the winter months. Please take care around the area of Coppergate ducks may be sleeping on the highway.

If you notice any items of pollution in the Mere please contact Yorkshire Water or the Parish Council immediately.

<u>Village Maintenance -</u> Village maintenance is always ongoing and you will still see Ross around the village carrying out some jobs.

The Parish Council are continually contacted by residents regarding the parking of vehicle on grass verges – during the winter months the verges are very soft and vehicles parking on the verges are making deep ruts, these ruts are dangerous so we would ask that no vehicles are parked on any grass verges in the village to allow the verges to recover.

<u>The Telephone Kiosks</u> – in the near future you may see books and notices in the Telephone kiosks please feel free to take a book and return when you have read it.

<u>Dog Fouling</u> – Please be a responsible dog owner and carry a bag at all times to collect, take home and bin any excrement from your dog.

The Parish Council have to follow the guidelines as set out by ERYC and details are available on the ERYC web site for reporting any dog fouling in the Parish

The Parish Council are regularly contacted by residents with concerns regarding the parking of motor vehicles in the village, and it would help relieve some congestion if households with garage and parking areas on site would park their vehicles within their own curtilage

During the dark days and evenings please be visible on your walks and cycle rides by wearing high visibility clothing
