Techy Tea CIC's friendly and knowledgeable staff will offer one-to-one assistance, troubleshooting, and advice on any technology-related issues or questions.

In addition to the drop-in session, Techy Tea CIC will also host weekly workshops at Nafferton Village Hall, where they will dive deeper into specific topics, such as online safety, social media, online shopping, or video calling. The workshops will be interactive and hands-on and will cater to different levels of experience and interest. The workshops will start in March time.
