NAFFERTON FREE LOFT INSULATION SCHEME

afferton Parish Council has agreed to support a project that hopes to supply free loft insulation and cavity wall insulation to houses in the village. The project, suggested by Councillor Michael Jackson, aims to cut people's fuel bills whilst reducing the carbon footprint of the village. For example, a typical 3 bedroom house could save £300 per year on heating by installing loft insulation and £200 per year with cavity wall insulation.

The Parish Council agreed to set up an environment sub-committee to get the project underway and Mr Jackson would like to hear from any environmentally minded residents who'd like to help. They would aim to meet bimonthly with the aim of finding funding for the project in the first instance then administering the project once underway. [There are already schemes available for installing subsidised insulation. Cost can be as little as £75, or free in certain circumstances, so are well worth it. Contact Mr Jackson for more information.]

EASTER FUN ABOARD THE PARTY BUS & EGG HUNT

Nafferton Under Fives, supported by *Party Kids* of *Hutton Cranswick*, are running an exciting fundraising event on Good Friday afternoon!

'Sid' the Party Bus will be stopping at Nafferton School playground and inviting passengers onboard to enjoy an array of soft play equipment.

To ensure children get to enjoy Sid safely, 30 minute play times will be divided according to age range. Toddlers (supervised by parents) are being invited onboard between 2-2:30pm, pre-schoolers (age 3+) 2:30-3:30pm and 5-8's 3:30-4:30pm. Tickets are limited and available from Londis shop, (or on the day, places permitting).

There will also be an Egg Hunt, Easter themed competitions, cake stall and craft activities!

NAFFERTON UNDER 5's & COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTRE

project newsletter has been set-up to keep residents informed on the status of the proposed Nafferton Under Fives and Community Resource Centre. The first of these is now available from the Post Office, the school and as a download from the Nafferton village website, www.nafferton.net. For those wanting a brief overview, here are the key project facts:-

Project partners: Nafferton Feoffees Trust, Nafferton Under Fives & the Parish Council.

Partner's Vision: Development of a purpose built facility providing pre-school education, community and voluntary services. This will include: community/education suite, kitchen, play area (specifically for U5's) & car park.

Why is the project focused on Nafferton Under 5's? The pre-school need access to outdoor play space due to changing OFSTED requirements. Under the restraints of the village hall, this expansion is impossible and would mean an end to Nafferton's only pre-school provision.

Public Access/Use The proposed building will be open to the public for the use of individuals, groups and clubs. Everyone will be able to book use of the community and meeting facilities which will be accessible and affordable.

Site: A number of site options are being explored.

Cost: Projected cost for the scheme is approximately £400k. Partners are committed to keeping costs to a minimum but want to ensure the best facilities are provided. The Trust will part fund the project and funding applications will be made to the Big Lottery, WREN and BIFFA.

Site Management: Nafferton Feoffees Trust will manage the site with key partners being represented on a Local Management group along with a community representative.

Public Consultation: The consultation held in December was attended by 49 residents, 80% of whom fully supported proposals. Concerns identified included ecofriendliness, location and parking, these will be taken into account in the design and operational management of the facilities. Questionnaires have also been circulated around the village, with 95% of respondents indicating support of the scheme.

Timescales: Planning Application - March 2010. Submission of Funding bids - May 2010. Assessment process - May to early summer.

What happens next? - Draw up detailed plans

- Complete land negotiations
- Apply for planning consent
- Apply for funding

NAFFERTON MILLENNIUM COMMITTEE (NMC)

Some villagers may ask... Who are they?... What are they?...What do they do?...

Well it is a Registered Charity and under its constitution its objects are to "promote such charitable purposes for the benefit of the communities of Nafferton and the surrounding area" and that is exactly what it does.

It was actually formed in MAY 1998 in readiness for the Millennium Year. It may have up to 9 executive committee members, currently there are 7 such members including Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. The General Committee is made up of representatives from any of the many Nafferton and district clubs, societies and organisations as well as anyone else in the village who may show an interest or wishes to become involved.

Over the years we have raised money by doing all sorts of tasks, and still do. For instance we have provided car parking services for events held on Driffield Show ground and by the time this Newsletter is printed and delivered we shall have been parking cars for the 12th Annual Spring Plant Fair that is organised by the Kelk Garden Club on the Showground. In August we provide a mixture of Services for the now quite famous Driffield Steam Rally again on the Showground.

How do we fulfil these tasks..... well we use volunteers from Nafferton, men and women of all ages who are just pleased to give up a few hours of their time usually organised on a rota basis (3 or 4 hours at a time maybe) and we have a lot of fun meeting members of 'Joe' public. And in return NMC receive a donation quite often previously agreed.

NMC also run other fund raising events, such as the Race Night which we have held annually in March for some years and this year was no exception. It really is a fun night but whatever we organise we try to ensure that it is sensibly affordable.

Many of you may recall and probably joined in the fun of the party we held on the school playing field to celebrate the Queens Jubilee in 2002, Then again in 2008 we held our own version of the 'lympics ending up with a live band playing 60's type music. Both were fun events and NMC were pleased to finance them.

Even more importantly over the past 10 years we have been proud to be able to give financial support often just when it was needed to many village organisations: Rainbows, Cubs, Scouts, Cricket and Tennis clubs etc and most recently £10,000 to the Playground committee. At least all our volunteers see moneys that they have helped to earn coming back in, to support village needs.

NMC also owns and runs the white Minibus which you see regularly in use. It operates on not-for-profit lines; we have several regular contracts some with East Riding of Yorkshire

Council and of course it is available for private hire. If you wish to make a booking please call the co-ordinator on **0783 352 8618**. We now have 2 paid drivers responsible for driving the minibus, and several volunteer drivers

Over the years we have been in existence we have ploughed over £30,000 back into Nafferton Village organisations and needless to say we hope to be able to continue to do so. Occasionally we need a few more volunteers either for driving, car parking etc or for fund raising events, so if you feel so inclined, please do not hesitate to give John Gledhill a ring on 01377 254354.

So you now know a little bit of what we are about, but who are we? Well the committee is made up of Symon Fraser (Chairman), Sheila Cook (Secretary), John Gledhill (Treasurer), John Rudd, Sarah Sellar, Allan Hook and Paul Nicholson MBE. We try to meet at least once per month to review all our operations and we hold our AGM every May, where we have reports on our activities, and invite those we've helped during the year to come and show how they have used our donations. Anyone who is interested is invited to come to the AGM, which this year will be held on Thursday 13 May at 7.30pm in the Methodist School Room.

Now having read this resume, we hope we shall be able to meet you at one or other of our events or come to the AGM in May, we shall be pleased to see you.
