### Notes from the Parish Council...

- 1. Free dog poo bags are available from the Post Office and the Londis shop. Please use bags rather than leaving dog mess on the pavements and public areas for pedestrians/children to walk in.
- 2. A weather station is operating in Nafferton and its records are available online at <a href="http://www.wunderground.com/personal-weather-station/dashboard?ID=IENGLAND1204#history">http://www.wunderground.com/personal-weather-station/dashboard?ID=IENGLAND1204#history</a> or through a link on the Nafferton.net website.
- 3. There has been an application made for grit bins for the bottom of Station Road near Mill Chase, on the Nunnings and for St Quintins. A request has been made to ERYC to extend the gritting route along Westgate past the school and the Middle St end of Coppergate. These applications will be considered over the next few months.
- 4. A survey, kindly undertaken by ERYC to examine if a pedestrian crossing by the school was viable, found that the traffic flow was too low and numbers of pedestrians insufficient to justify at present. Alternative arrangements are being investigated.



Drivers are asked to please be mindful of speed when driving along Markman Lane. Safety concern has been raised by a resident regarding the speed drivers are coming along this singletrack road - especially given the absence of street lights, making it especially dangerous for pedestrians/dog walkers walking into the village from the outskirts in the evening.



### **Decision Made to Move Post Office to New Premises**

The Post Office have written to confirm that the proposal to move the Nafferton Post Office branch to Londis at 32 Middle Street will go ahead. From there it will operate as one of the new local style Post Office branches. Posters will now be displayed in branch to let customers know about the

decision. Final arrangements for the move are now taking place and further posters will be provided in branch soon to let customers know the actual date the move will take place.



# Connor Swims to Success at Yorkshire Championships

11 year old Connor Gardener has been making a big splash at the Yorkshire Swimming Championships in recent weeks. Competing in Leeds on the weekend of 6<sup>th</sup> February, his 5am Saturday start was well-rewarded as he shaved seconds off his 200m individual medley time to finish 12<sup>th</sup> from 27. In the first of his two Sunday races, Connor again smashed his personal-best starting time of 2.55.70, swimming the 200m freestyle in just 2.46.85, placing him 13<sup>th</sup> out of 24. Next was the 200m backstroke, again his personal best time of 3.15.11 was obliterated as Connor swam to 5<sup>th</sup> place (out of 25) in just 3.00.78, to pick up a finalist prize.

Connor's next round of Yorkshire Championship races came at the end of February in Sheffield where he swam four 50m races against the best 11 year olds in Yorkshire. Again Connor did himself proud, beating his personal best times in both the Butterfly and Breaststroke. His finest swimming came in the Freestyle and Backstroke where he again took seconds off his PB times to finish fourth out of 88 in both races, securing a place in his first finals - two in one day!

The 50m Freestyle final saw him swim faster still, finishing 4<sup>th</sup> overall with a new PB time of 32.89 seconds, just fractions of a second outside the winning time of 32.27s!

On top of an already amazing swim performance, Connor

had more to come and the Backstroke final proved to be his triumph, he swam to victory with a time of just 37 seconds, (another new personal record by more than 3 seconds from the start of the day!) winning a well-deserved trophy and delighting his proud parents.

Congratulations Connor! And thanks to your parents for sharing your news!
