

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL...

The Parish Council meetings are every second Tuesday at 7.30pm at the Rec Club, and all parishioners are welcome. If there are items to go on the Agenda, it's helpful if we can have these a minimum of 7 days in advance, otherwise we may not be able to fully discuss them at that meeting due to timescales and/or missing information.

Nafferton Scarecrow Festival: This year's
Scarecrow Festival will run the weekend of Sat
1st-Sun 2nd July. The theme for the Scarecrows is

'At the Theatre'. There will be lots of stalls and activities at the Village Hall and around the village all weekend. As the Recreation Club building works will still be ongoing, we will be holding the 'Crow Down' on Sat afternoon/evening in the gardens at the Bluebell pub where there will be a BBQ, bouncy castle and kiddies' rides (weather permitting).

Entry Forms will be enclosed in this Newsletter and will also be available from the Village Shop and Chip Shop.

We have a number of raffle prizes kindly donated already, but if you do wish to donate please contact the Scarecrow team or the Parish Council for details.

Apple Press: The Parish Council have been gifted the Apple Press from Nafferton Millennium Committee. It is available for all parishioners to use, so please contact the Parish Clerk should you wish to make use of this equipment.

Defibrillator: The village defibrillator is now situated on the outside of Lavender Court, 32–34 High Street. The instructions for use are simple and are on the equipment,

but if you have any queries please contact the Parish Council. Thanks again to the Scarecrow team for their fundraising efforts to provide this!

The Mere: Yorkshire Water believe they have identified the source of the cross contamination into the Mere and are working with the householder to resolve the problem.



Recreation Club New Build: Foundations are completed and there has been good progress on the link road and service installations. Inclement weather set back the start of the beam and block installation but we expect this to be made up during the brick work stages. Brickwork will be up around the new building by the end of March, bricklayers will then begin to form the internal rooms. Roofing works will commence at the start of April, the trusses need lifting into place before the roof covering can be started, which will get the construction watertight by the middle of May. A generator has been installed for temporary power to the existing Club house but we expect the new meters to be in place in April. Keep up to date with progress via the Recreation Club Facebook page where we are keeping a pictorial record of the project!



Connor Swims to Success at Yorkshire Swimming Championships & Qualifies for Regionals!



Thanks to his swimming success at the end of last year, Connor Gardener again qualified for the Yorkshire Swimming Championships -

this year competing in the 12yr old category.

On 11th February, Connor had an early journey to Ponds Forge, Sheffield, for an 8am warm up!

He swam 50m backstroke and 50m butterfly in the morning races, finishing in the top ten in backstroke heats - a finish which secured him a place in the 50m backstroke final later that morning. Connor managed to finish 4th overall in this, against strong competition.

After a short break for lunch he was back in the pool for 50m breaststroke and 50m freestyle. Connor managed to finish in the top ten in freestyle heats, qualifying for his second final of the day. He swam as hard as he could against swimmers from all over the Yorkshire region to finish 3rd overall.

Connor's impressive swim times at the Yorkshire Championships has led to qualification for the NER's (North East Regional Championships) in both the 50m backstroke and 50m freestyle events. The North East Regions sees the very best swimmers from the region come together, it is the next level of competition and the first time Connor has achieved the qualification time. He is looking forward to seeing how he compares! His family are very proud of him, and thank Driffield Junior Amateur Swimming Club for all the hard work the coaches put in to help him achieve these results.

Quest for Family Knowledge...My name is Anne Britton, and I am trying to find out more about my great-grandmother, Edith Annie Broadley, who was born in Nafferton around 1850. She married my great-grandfather, Robert Britton, around 1882 in Haxby, near York, where they lived and farmed for many years. Robert Britton was a breeder and exporter of Yorkshire Coach Horses, about which I am also seeking information, such as stud books and stud cards. The Bulmers Directory for 1892 shows there were two Broadleys living in Nafferton at the time: Mrs Mary Broadley, and Mr Henry Broadley, a farmer and joiner. Nafferton Millennium Committee Closedown

The official closedown of NMC is now completed. All the remaining funds or assets have been distributed to other Nafferton organisations to help those groups to deliver their many and varied community services to Nafferton. The Charity has now been dissolved and deregistered.

I have had the privilege to have chaired the Trustees committee since the inception of the group on the 29th October 1997 right through to the end of the body on March 23rd 2017. Two other committee members have also been there throughout this time and they by their dedication and steadfast work for the village have made the job of chairing an easy pleasure. These two extraordinary people are Sheila Cook and

John Gledhill and the village (and I) owe them a big vote of thanks for their amazing service over the past two decades.

The real success of NMC was due to the amazing way that many villagers adopted the work of the group and volunteered to help at the many events staffed or run by NMC and our thanks go to all of those "willing folk" who have been a part of our work, or who have supported our events over the past twenty years. My special thanks go to the considerable band of villagers who have served as trustees over the years, without exception hard working, positive people who have given through NMC to the village time and time again.

The residual (now distributed) funds totalled almost £97,000 pounds and I am delighted to be able to report that this money will stay in the village

assisting many village groups and organisations who serve all age groups of the village. The very final remaining money will be supporting the supper at the Scouts Race Night on 22nd of April.
