The Play Area — The Parish Council are updating the Play area, this is to ensure the village has play equipment that reflects its needs. Charity Sponsored Swim



This summer I am taking on the ultimate challenge in swimming. I will be swimming the Channel for Aspire (a UK spinal injury charity). I've always been a wetsuit warrior, a fan of warm water and calm lakes. So what better way to raise money for an amazing charity than to force myself into cold water for months on end and then swim to France?

The challenge of swimming the Channel is not to be underestimated.

- The English Channel is 21 miles wide.
- The temperature of water in a swimming pool is 27 degrees, whereas the Channel is more like 16-18 degrees.
- The Channel is the busiest shipping lane in the world with 800 tankers and 200 ferries etc passing through a day.
- The swim will be observed and verified by the CS&PF so will be following strict Channel swim rules.
- We cannot wear a wetsuit for this swim
- The fastest relay swim crossing is 6 hours 52 minutes by the US National Men's Swim Team in 1990.
- The average time for an English Channel relay swim crossing is 12 hours and 45 minutes and 11 seconds
- Six swimmers will swim in rotation (one hour each) until we touch down in France.

Why am I swimming for Aspire?

6 people a day are paralyzed by spinal cord injury. It can happen at any time, anywhere and to anyone. Many spinal injuries happen when people are living their lives and minding their own businesses - a fall, a traffic accident or sports accidents. The consequences of spinal injury can be huge and varied. Not just leaving people paralyzed or in wheelchairs, but also impacting people's mental health, access to housing and ability to work. Aspire provide support and advice to help people get their lives back together - legal advice, support accessing healthcare and helping people access benefits or houses.
