#### NAFFERTON ALL SAINTS CHURCH BELL RINGING BAND

Church bell ringing is a traditional part of village life and one that helps to make this village special.

The tradition of Change Bell Ringing can be traced back to the seventeenth century and is believed to go back even further. The tolling of a church bell originally notified the village of the different call times to prayer, each individual bell having a different note and sound, signalling a different meaning and prayer time. Sometime during the 17c, one bright spark got the idea of ringing all the bells in a church tower one after the other in a pattern. As each bell is tuned to a different note, as with any musical instrument, string those notes together and you create music. Change Bell Ringing was invented.

Here, in All Saints' Church, we have six bells we can ring to create a tune. We also have two older bells that are not rung except on special occasions. These two bells date back to the 1450s, whereas our main ringing bells are Victorian. Larger churches can have twelve or more bells, small churches may only have two or three or none.

Church bells can range in size and weight from very small, weighing a couple of hundred pounds to enormous bells weighing 2 tons. All Saints Church has a set of lighter weight bells, the heaviest weighing just over 8cwts or 412kilos. We are very lucky in Nafferton as our bells have a good reputation and are better than most I have rung in other churches. They are of a weight, that makes it easier for a ringer to change a bell's ringing speed (interval between rings), this is important for trainee ringers or for someone from another band who is not familiar with our bells. People come from all over the country to ring our church bells. One of our last visitors was a ringer from St Paul's in London.

Our group of bell ringers is called a band in exactly the same way as any small group of musicians is called a band. Only, our musical instruments are fixed in one location, making church towers and their bells, the largest percussion instruments in the world. It can take six months to learn the basics (you can't very well practice at home) with years of learning still to come as new methods and ringing patterns are learnt.

In Nafferton, our Tower Captain (band leader), is Ross Holmes. Under Ross's leadership and patient teaching method, he has increased our band membership

from four full-time ringers after lockdown, to eight with another full-time member in the making. Never wanting to stand still, Ross has improved our band's ringing skills enormously and happily shares these skills with other towers in the local area.

All our band members helped during the Nafferton Village Scarecrow weekend for 2022, not only raising money for All Saints' Church but also for our bell fund to maintain the bells. And, as you would expect, we also ring to celebrate marriages at All Saints' Church.

Ross performed the solemn duty of tolling a single bell to mark the passing of our beloved Queen Elizabeth II. However, on a happier note, we at Nafferton are all looking forward to ringing and celebrating the coronation of King Charles III in May 2023.

After this brief note (no pun intended), I hope you all have a better understanding of what Church Bell Ringing is all about and can appreciate how lucky Nafferton is to have a thriving bell ring band when many other villages are losing this ancient but important tradition.
