I commented to our Churchwardens, who had been asked if we were closing down, that I felt like buying a can of bright red gloss paint and painting on the boarding of the East Window "Open for God's business as usual". The fact is that it doesn't look very pretty at present, but when the first phase is completed in the early Autumn, the roof will have been restored and so will the spire. After that we are hopeful of replacing the heating and lighting and restoring the beautiful ceiling. Our regular services are going ahead and we are fundraising for the project as usual. English Heritage has been generous in its grant and the whole project is being ably managed by our Works Committee chaired by Steve Turner who lives in the village. So it's 'All Systems go!' .Many of you have played your part in this by your support of our events throughout the year. Thank you and do keep up the good work!
