During our food-based occupations week we had a bakery with fresh bread, the children made pizzas and naan breads, and for those children leaving us to start school in September, lunch at Nafferton Primary School was organised. This was a lovely experience and an important part of the transition for the children starting school -we will be arranging many more visits during the next half term! Next week we're learning about farmers and farming and are looking forward to visiting Honeysuckle farm!

We would like to say a big thank you to the Nafferton Millennium Committee, who are not only helping us towards transport costs for our Farm Trip, but presented us with a cheque at their recent AGM. With this gift we are going to purchase some new bicycles and a scooter for the children to use in the Village Hall.

We have many more exciting things planned for the next half term, we are involved with the Nafferton 'Lympics, we are participating in the Nafferton in Bloom competition and will be planting up the planters in the small play park with a Jubilee theme. We will be further developing our introduction to phonics programme and will be planning our annual beach trip – we're also hoping to transform the village hall into the seaside!

We are also looking at offering some play sessions to parents /carers of local children and this will be a great opportunity for parents to network with others and to spend time with their children doing activities which cannot always be done at home. Ideas we have had include Messy Play with jelly and gloop, Song/Story time and Sensory sessions. We would also love to hear any ideas and suggestions as to what parents may like too, so please feel free to drop us a line or pop in and have a look around and a chat at any time, the staff and I would be really pleased to show you round.

Finally, the children this week appeared very happy when I wore my pre-school uniform for the first time, they said "Look Sonya is a blue lady now", what a wonderful thing to hear during my first few weeks in a new position! # Yorkshire in Bloom Judges Report on Nafferton, Spring 2012

The judges visited our village on 4<sup>th</sup> April. Here is a summary of their comments. We shall be judged again in July after which we shall be told of any award we may be given.

The judges said:- "Nafferton In Bloom demonstrated the commitment and skills of the members of their group. Of particular note was the production of the portfolio this year together with the innovative management plan. Nafferton have rejuvenated the In Bloom through partnership working and the continued growth of your working village.

#### **Section A: Horticultural Achievement**

Highlights included the colourful displays and open spaces around Jubilee Gardens and at the War Memorial. The construction and planting of Beals' Homes sponsored brick planter at the coal yard provides additional focus. Colin is to be commended for his work and planting at the sheep wash. Although there are several businesses participating like the Beautician & Hairdressers, the spring route could benefit from more floral displays in the main street showing business involvement.

#### Section B: Environmental Responsibility

It is evident that pride of place is at the heart of Nafferton In Bloom. The maintenance of the high bank at the Church by Nafferton Scouts has developed this 'difficult' area with wild flower planting. Our thanks to Dylan for telling us about this. The clearance of the Beck and footpaths alongside demonstrates the commitment to environmental responsibility in Nafferton. Good to hear about the developments for the Mere with advice from Yorkshire Wildlife Trust. Maybe consideration could be given to the creation of a heritage trail or leaflet possibly by the Youth groups. Consider further tree planting on the Parks.

### **Section C: Community Participation**

Nafferton in Bloom are at the top of the game in terms of community participation. Your management plan, Nafferton flag, event posters, newsletter, funding support, partnership working with the Parish Council, together with new members on your committee demonstrates this. We look forward to seeing your projects develop, especially the work around the railway station and negotiations with Network Rail; very little for the judges to add - except perhaps a little more information on your work and involvement with younger members of the community.

Our village will be judged again by Yorkshire in Bloom on the afternoon of **Friday 20<sup>th</sup> July**. They will meet us at The King's Head and walk round the North of our village inspecting properties and public sites on Middle Street, Parsonage Close, New Road, North Street, Beech Grove, Howe Lane, Coppergate and Westgate.

Village judging for the Londis Shield (business premises) and the Feoffees' Trophy (all residences with no front garden but opening directly onto the pavement) will be in the week beginning 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Entry for these is automatic. NB. it would be good if all displays could be kept in good condition for the Yorkshire in Bloom judging!

Entries for the children's Primepak competitions are to be in at 1 Priestgate by 28<sup>th</sup> June. Entrants must be under 16 years of age. Competition 1 for the Primepak Cup is for a planted pot or garden tray. Competition 2 is to create a poster to publicise Nafferton in Bloom. **Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW)** All businesses and groups employing more than one member of staff should have an appointed first aid person – but keeping training current can be expensive! We have been given an opportunity to put on a First Aid at Work training course for the small businesses and Charity groups of Nafferton. We can offer places on this course from as little as £50 (plus VAT) per person, and by arranging the training as a Community group, we can secure discounted - or even free places - should uptake be high enough! The course is being run by Jon Hilton, Jon is a board member for the Association of First Aiders, a former bomb disposal trauma medic and currently team medic for Great Britain Rugby League All Stars. *Course Information:* This course is ideal for smaller work place environments that present minimal health and safety risks i.e. small companies, offices, shops and employees who travel or work off site. It is designed for those who need to have a basic knowledge of First Aid and meets the recommendations by the health and safety executive for the appointed person rule and regulations 198. Students will cover the following topics:

- Rules and regulations
- Wounds and Bleeding
- Burns

- Basic life support
- Fractures
- Heart related conditions
- *Course Duration / Qualification:* 6 hrs providing a recognized 3 year qualification (HSE).
- Course Price: up to £50.00 plus V.A.T per person
