

NAFFERTON SCARECROW FESTIVAL Scarecrow fever is spreading in Nafferton ahead of the village's first Scarecrow Festival, due to take place over the weekend 21st -22nd June!

Plans for the festival are shaping up well, in addition to the 'Milestone' themed scarecrow trail (so named due to the number of significant anniversary/birthday celebrations happening in Nafferton Village this year), villagers can expect a host of fun attractions including giant inflatables and bouncy castle(s), craft stalls, side stalls, craft activities, an apple press demonstration, refreshments and face painting. Maps for the scarecrow trail (featuring information such as activity times and location – and a voting slip for you to vote for your favourite scarecrow) can be purchased from the Village Hall between 10am-6pm on Saturday 21st and from 10am-4pm Sunday 22nd.





Nafferton Primary School 100th Birthday Celebrations

This is an especially exciting term at Nafferton Primary School. The children have been busy learning about life and

historical events over the past 100 years and the whole school experienced an Edwardian day in May when children and staff spent the day dressed in Edwardian costume, ate a themed lunch and learnt about what school If you haven't yet entered a scarecrow for the actual competition don't worry - there's still time! Organisers hope the event will be well supported as it is designed to bring the whole community together in a fun and lighthearted way whilst giving the village's wealth of clubs and organisations an opportunity to raise funds for their particular group.

It is also possible to offer mechanisms for feedback and responses to questions from ideas put forward by our Parish Council and other organisations.

We already provide a newsfeed service enabling users to have village news items sent to them automatically. This can easily be extended to include other items such as the village Newsletter. The site can similarly act as a central hub to coordinate Facebook, Twitter and YouTube from other village organisations. The website also has the ability to host many forms of content, from documents, images, surveys and videos.

NEW FUNDING FOR 2 YEAR OLDS

Do you receive any government support e.g. Income support, Income-based Jobseekers Allowance, Child Tax Credits etc... if so your 2 year old could be eligible to 15 hours free childcare per week! Plus from September the government have extended the criteria, a child will also be eligible if you get Working Tax Credits (earning less than £16,190 a year), or if your child has a current statement of special educational needs (SEN) or an education, health and care plan, gets Disability Living Allowance or they've left care through special guardianship or an adoption or residence order.
