Our attempt at litter picking on 12th April was hampered by the poor weather. A number of members and villagers turned out and our appreciation goes to them.

We now have dates for judging of the floral competitions. Judging for the **NAFFERTON FEOFFEE'S TROPHY** will take place on 13th/14th July. Judging for the LONDIS TROPHY will take place during week commencing 4th July.

Details of entry to the **PRIMEPAK FOODS** competitions are prominently displayed around the village.

We have previously advised of our entry into the **YORKSHIRE IN BLOOM competition**. We now have a date for judging which will be **THURSDAY 21**st **JULY**. We look forward to welcoming the judges and providing them with a superb display of colour. We know that all villagers will take the opportunity to impress the judges with their own personal displays as they have done in the past.

Parish Council News

The P.C. is still waiting for a planning decision from ERYC relative to the Recreation Clubs new build. There may be news on this subject in June, as a meeting was taking place imminently. Also they are still waiting for an up-date on the erection of a Phone Mast at the Recreation Club. On the subject of dog fouling, dog control orders will shortly be replaced by PSPO's (Public Spaces Protection Orders) and fresh signs will be produced when these commence. However the penalties and the laws in relation to dog fouling remain the same.

Relative to the Mere, over the years, people have fed the water fowls lots of bread, so attempts are being made to encourage protein enhanced foods to be fed so improving the birds health. It is recommended that you place food into the Mere as against leaving it on the side(which would be a health hazard) and if feeding bread, wholegrain would be better. Try not to feed to excess.

Child safety in Westgate.

ERYC conducted a survey to examine if a pedestrian crossing was viable, but it proved that the traffic flow was too low and the number of pedestrians was also insufficient for it to warrant a pedestrian crossing. Villagers must continue to be very alert when in that area, particularly at school times.

Two or three other items of Parish Council news.

Firstly, the second annual Funfair held last September proved a success with good attendance figures and the operators would like to make it a regular annual event

Secondly, whilst waiting for a decision from the ERYC planning dept, we continue to have bowls, tennis, cricket and football teams playing at the Rec and working on how we can make the best use of the playing fields.

Thirdly, the P.C. is taking over the Citizens Link Kiosk at the top of the village for a small rental value from ERYC, rather than seeing it demolished, any ideas for usage would be welcome, please contact a Parish Clerk (anne@annetyler.orangehome.co.uk) Incidentally there are 2 vacancies on the Parish Council at present, if interested please contact Anne Tyler at the e-mail address above.
