
NAFFERTON WOMENS' INSTITUTE

The doors are reopened at 2:30pm and the show will be opened and trophies presented at 3pm by Rev Robert Amos.

During the afternoon cream scones, tea and coffee are served. At 3:45pm items can be removed and prize money collected and unwanted items will be auctioned off at 4pm.

The show is designed to be fun so please browse the schedule, get your entries in, and enjoy the show. All money raised is for the upkeep of Nafferton Village Hall.

Swan on the Mere - as per residents wishes the PC applied for a licence to Natural England for removal of the aggressive male swan on the Mere. Unfortunately, this was rejected as there is no legal reason for them to grant removal. Protecting other wildfowl does not come under the Natural England licensing provisions. Only if we have clear, substantive proof of health and safety risk to public can they look into granting a licence. Any other enquires on this subject should be directed to David Brown at Natural England.

Due to the success of CCTV in the large play park in reducing litter, dog fouling and anti-social behaviour we are looking to introduce this into the small play park also.

Dog fouling warning notices are being repainted on the pavements again in another effort to deter this practice. Dog owners - please respect your community and ensure you pick up after your pet!

Thank you to all the volunteers (on the Parish Council or otherwise) who continue to do unpaid jobs around the village in their spare time - litter picking, maintenance jobs, fund raising, and generally helping to keep Nafferton a great place to live!
