Parish Council Elections 4 May 2023

By the time of the publication of this Newsletter 13 Parish Councillors will have signed their Acceptance of Office as a Parish Councillor and declared their pecuniary and non-pecuniary interests.

Every Councillor must be guided by Nafferton Parish Council Standing Orders and the Code of Conduct as approved by ERYC and in turn accepted by Nafferton Parish Council.

<u>Verges are an amenity for the whole community and not intended for</u> <u>Vehicles</u>

Parking vehicles on verges causes damage, which is unsightly, can create hazards for visually impaired, disabled and elderly people or those who may wish to cross over the verge. Such damage is very costly to repair.

In addition, parking on the verge can also damage underground services which could create danger and inconvenience to residents and pedestrians

In certain circumstances inconsiderate parking can be an offence, which could incur a court fine.

Please be a responsible vehicle owner and where possible park your vehicle in a garage or within the curtilage of your own property.
