Nafferton News

Nafferton Parish Council www.nafferton.net

The Parish Council meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30pm at the Recreation Club – these meetings are public and open for anyone to attend.

VE Day - A large number of people attended the VE Day Service at the War Memorial and Jubilee Gardens in the centre of the village. The Parish Council would like to thank all who took part in the event, the organisational skills of a few ensured the event ran smoothly.

Family Fun Day - A fun day for all was held at our Family Fun Day at the Recreation Club. Families were able to enjoy picnics and stalls in the sun for free. Children enjoyed a range of exciting inflatables, including a huge climbing wall and slides for just £5 to play all day. We had all sorts of stalls, and the cakes offered by Nafferton WI were delicious! A BBQ and cold drinks were also available by the recreation centre. The Mere – Nafferton Mere is owned by Nafferton Parish Council and under no circumstances must anything go in or on The Mere without prior approval at a Parish Council Meeting.

Following on from the advice from professionals, we are actively working on reducing the industrial scale feeding of the ducks in the Mere, which is causing several issues. This is the priority at present. We are working with ERYC on this matter and continue to engage with local ecology partners on the Habitat Management Plan.

Yorkshire Water has confirmed there have been no reported incidents at Nafferton Mere in recent years. If you notice any items of pollution in the Mere, please contact Yorkshire Water or the Parish Council immediately.

Village Maintenance - Village maintenance is always ongoing, and you will still see Ross around the village carrying out some jobs.

Dog Fouling – Please be a responsible dog owner and carry a bag at all times to collect, take home, and bin any excrement from your dog. The Parish Council must follow the guidelines as set out by ERYC and details are available on the ERYC website for reporting any dog fouling in the Parish.
