"Allotments allow local people to grow their own fruit and vegetables" said Parish Council Chairman, Mike Jackson, "This has many environmental benefits as it cuts down on food miles, encourages composting, builds a sense of community, promotes healthy exercise and allows the production of your own organic food. The Parish Council supports the idea of allotments in the village and just needs somebody to come forward with some land that can be used"
