Issue Number 57 – August 2011 OUR MERE IS DYING

Later this year your Parish Council will be starting work to bring the Mere back to life. The accumulation of silt on the bed (up to 2 metres in some places) has resulted in the death of all plant life but blanket weed. This has removed most of the plants and water insects needed by the wildfowl which explains why their numbers have reduced over the past years. The life remaining is mainly sticklebacks on which the kingfishers feed.

The Yorkshire Wildlife Wetlands Officer has inspected the mere and made suggestions. The plan is to repair the island with stakes and brushwood to continue to provide a safe roosting area. The silt will have to be sampled and tested for pollution as the water in the mere is brought from farmland on the Wolds through the many springs in its bed and from run off from the village streets. Following that a scheme will be agreed for removing, or moving, the silt to encourage biodiversity. We may be able to create marsh areas and/or reed beds with a wider range of plant life to attract more insects and small animals. We shall be looking for volunteers to help with some of the work.
