ALLOTMENTS & THE FUTURE OF THE RECREATION CLUB

T the Nafferton Parish Council meeting on 11th July the subject of allotments in the village was discussed. The Parish Council has been offered land at the Recreation Club to use for allotments and support has also been received from the Foeffees, which will enable this project to begin. Approximately 30 allotments can be set up at the back of the field. This still leaves space for the cricket pitch and two football pitches. The Parish Council supports the plan in principle and would like to explore if a suitable lease can be arranged so all parties know where they stand before we go ahead.

It was also announced that the Nafferton Recreation Club has approached the Parish Council to ask if the Parish Council will take over running the Club. The Parish Council agreed to look into this and will find out all the details. It was suggested at the meeting that we can then inform the village more fully, possibly at an open meeting later in the year or by way of the newsletter.

The good news is that they received eight enquiries, which led to five actual applicants and after interviews two drivers have been appointed. The Mibus service, which operates on Tuesdays and Thursdays, is a door to door pick up

service which takes you into Driffield and returns you back to your home later in the day, and if you have a bus pass, then the service is free.
