RECREATION CLUB NEW BUILD

Sue Tait, Chair of Nafferton Parish Council is pleased to share exciting news on the new building proposed for Nafferton Recreation Club.

An open public meeting was held on Monday 11th July, where it was announced that after some 7 months of deliberation, East Riding of Yorkshire Council had approved plans for a new community facility at Nafferton Recreation Club (see images page 3)

In fact some of you may have been at the meeting, or involved in May 2015 where the initial plans were first shown, or included in the leaflet and door to door discussions we had with local residents at the time.

The Parish Council is working on this project with the Nafferton Feoffees Charities Trust which will be financing the building costs - I'm sure you join me in thanking them for such a generous offer for the village!

The new centre will provide extensive sports facilities and a public function room, as well as becoming the new home for the Nafferton Under Fives pre-school.

The plans approved by the council involve demolishing the existing sports changing rooms to provide the site for the new building of over 600 sq m (6,500 sq ft). The community facility will provide modern accommodation for the U5s preschool with an enclosed outdoor play area, which is something not available at its current site at the Village hall.

The facilities will be Sport England compliant, and include new changing rooms for home and away teams (as well as match officials), with showers and toilets, and a public meeting hall and

function room for use by a range of community groups and private functions.

As per the approved plans there will be an additional access road and both Rec Club and residential parking to help the flow of traffic and ease current parking congestion around Eastlands.

Nafferton Parish Council is the Sole Corporate
Trustee of the Nafferton Recreation Club Charity we are working with the Feoffees and the
Architect, David Piercy, in the project
management of the build and will be managing
the building on an ongoing basis when it is up and
running.

Next steps:

- >Identify potential building contractors
- >Agree any alterations / conditions as set out by ERYC
- >Complete final design and specification and H & E specification
- >Out to Tender for the project (end Aug 2016)
- >Appoint main contractor (end Sept 2016)
- > Start build! (end Oct 2016) with expected completion Summer 2017

Nafferton is a growing community with lots of families and the Parish Council think it's important we provide the facilities to encourage youngsters to lead a healthy and active lifestyle. We hope you all agree and will support us on this.

With that in mind, we're now in a position to go ahead with applications for funding for developing the recreation grounds further – ie replacing the tennis hard courts including a multipurpose sports pitch for 5 a side, basketball, tennis and other sports, additional training pitch

for football, floodlighting for football - plus anything else the community might want us to look at that will be of recreational benefit.

We are still intending to create space for allotments at the bottom of the playing field.

There will be a lot of grant application writing in the next few months!

The Parish Council is a small team of volunteers, we welcome ideas, help and support from the rest of the village.

If the Rec is going to maximise this investment and become the centre of the community that we all hope it will be, it needs to be planned correctly now to take into account what village users actually need and want so that we get the frequent use of the facilities that will make it sustainable for future generations.

Other Parish Council news

The parish council have taken over the Citizens Kiosk at the top of the village to stop this from being demolished by ERYC. Plans are to use this for storage.

Nafferton Millennium Committee Extraordinary General Meeting Thursday 8th September

As agreed at the May AGM, NMC has been looking into how to wind up the charity, in line with its own constitutional requirements, and those of the Charity Commission. The first step is to hold an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) to consider the proposal to close down the charity, and we will hold this on Thursday 8th September at 7.30pm, in the Methodist School Room.

The proposal is: "That the Charity NMC having fulfilled its purpose is now closed down and its residual funds and assets are distributed in a way compliant with the Charitable Objectives of NMC and the requirements of the Charity Commission."

Once the above resolution has been agreed we will then be able to give details of how NMC's funds will be dispersed. Over the years we have gathered significant reserves. The close down of NMC will involve the distribution of these funds to village organisations whose projects meet certain criteria. If you represent a village organisation, please make every effort to attend.

Following the EGM, we will hold an information and advice evening for those wishing to apply for some of the funds.


This will explain the application form and assessment procedure, which has to be fairly rigorous to comply with Charity Commission requirements. Once explained, however, it should not be difficult. The Advice Evening will be held on Wednesday 21st September, again at 7.30pm in the Methodist School Room.

Village organisations will then have three months to send in their completed applications. The deadline for this will be midnight on Wednesday 21st December. In January 2017, the assessment process will begin and the money will be dispersed as soon as possible after that.

There are several critical dates in the above, but the first one is **Thursday 8th September** for the EGM. We look forward to seeing as many interested parties as possible. For more information, contact Sheila Cook on rcooksons@hotmail.com, or any committee member.



Nafferton Post Office and the Londis Shop

As one door closes another one opens, this is what happened in Nafferton. On the 12th July the PO closed its doors and on the 13th July the Londis Central Stores opened as your local Post Office. So the Londis Shop now offers the majority of services as a full PO but are open longer hours. The Post Office counter is open from 7AM-8PM Monday to Saturday and 9AM-5PM on a Sunday.

Newspapers and magazines are also now being sold at the Shop but Lynda and Kevin are sorry that they cannot offer a delivery service but they are very happy to save your papers for collection. On the subject of papers, Lynda and Kevin were very sorry about the first couple of days, letting us down, however this was something over which they had no control as the distributor decided not to deliver and then next day took them on a trip to Driffield and back to Hull and so they arrived back in Driffield somewhat late. They are pleased to report that everything seems to have now sorted itself out and the papers arrive early every morning (hopefully)!

They acknowledge that there has been a few teething problems with orders and they are grateful for our patience, as they are also with the speed at which they process the PO services, there is a lot to learn.

Lynda and Kevin have a super team of staff who are all pleased to welcome customers old and new and they hope we will all continue to support them in this new and demanding venture and in so doing keep the last remaining shop in Nafferton "OPEN".

Villagers will be pleased to see that Karen and Gill from the old PO have also joined the Londis team. Kev and Lynda remain very grateful for the support that the village has shown during this hectic period and will continue in their endeavours to provide us with the excellent service we have grown to expect.
