During the past couple of months roof tiling works have been completed, along with the installation of windows and doors. This has provided a water tight building, allowing for the floor screed to be laid and mechanical/electrical/joinery first fixes to be completed.

External works have progressed with the kerb line of the exit road being installed, as well as drainage works around the building.

Internal works will now progress with the installation of mechanical and electrical equipment – before plastering works can commence.

We are still on track to finish in November and will be holding an opening event to showcase the facilities - watch this space for more information!

Swimming Achievement

Connor Gardener swam really well recently and managed to improve his times enough to gualify for the North East Region Swimming Championships, this is a competition for the best swimmers from all of the North East of England. It is broken down into age groups and Connor swam as a 12 year old. It was held over two weekends in May and meant very early starts to travel to Sunderland Aquatic Centre for warm ups that started at 8am. The first weekend after arriving for the warm up Connor had to wait until around 12.30 before his race 50m freestyle. This was the first time he had swum at these championships and at this level of competition, it was also the first time swimming at this pool and after such a long wait managed to finish in 11th place, missing out on the final by 0.04 seconds.

The following weekend he was back in Sunderland for him to swim 50m backstroke. Again he had to wait all morning before he swam, this time he managed to make it to the final. This meant another long wait through the afternoon before his chance to swim in the final. He managed to finish in 8th place with a personal best time. All of his family are very proud of him, and thank the coaches at Drififeld Junior Amateur Swimming Club for all their hard work in helping him to achieve these results.

NAFFERTON AGAINST FRACKING

Have you woken up to fracking? [High Volume Hydraulic Fracturing for the Extraction of Shale Gas]

Villagers may have noticed one of the scarecrow entries in the recent festival aimed to raise awareness that Nafferton is now in a fracking licensed area - as is most of the East Riding.

Concerns about the risks of this controversial and unconventional gas industry and the impact it could have on our local area have led to a number of Nafferton residents getting together to form a group called Nafferton Against Fracking. Members of the group handed out information to residents during Scarecrow Festival weekend and asked villagers for their opinions on the subject... over the course of the weekend over 250 people signed to say that they were also concerned.



Taking inspiration from countries that have already banned fracking, such as France, Ireland

and Bulgaria, as well as a community in Australia who managed to put a stop fracking in their neighbourhood; the Nafferton Against Fracking group now meets regularly in the village hall. If you would like to come along to one of our meetings you would be most welcome!

The next meeting will be held on Monday 31st July at 7.00pm in the Village Hall. Future meetings will be advertised on the Nafferton Against Fracking facebook page, in the Driffield & Wolds Weekly on the Out & About page and in Nafferton Londis shop window.
