Parish Council News

The Parish Council meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm in The Clubhouse at The Recreation Club – these meetings are public and open for anyone to attend.

<u>The Play Area</u> – Various items of equipment have either been repaired or are in the process of being repaired – a new cargo net has been secured in place.

<u>The Mere</u> – Any routine maintenance required at the Mere will be carried out during the winter months. It has been noticed that some ducks are again sleeping in the road on the corner of Coppergate and we would ask motorists to be aware of this and take care.

<u>Village Maintenance -</u> This is a busy time of year for Ross to keep up with grasscutting etc so some items of village maintenance may have to be deferred until the autumn – but they will get done.

<u>Dog Fouling</u> – Please be a responsible dog owner and carry a bag at all times to collect, take home and bin any excrement from your dog.

<u>Agricultural Vehicles – It is getting to the time of year</u> when there may be more agricultural vehicles around please give these large vehicles some space and stay safe.

Nafferton Village Hall is located on Middle Street, Nafferton (opposite the village shop) and is now available for hire, for all your meetings, parties, fundraising events, please get in touch. It can be booked through Sheila on 01377 254249.

The hall has a well-equipped kitchen with plates, cutlery and glasses for 100 sittings, tables and chairs, use of cookers, fridges and an industrial dishwasher which are all included in the hire fee. We also have had the committee room which is a smaller hall at the rear of the building. It is newly decorated and has new carpets laid, with round tables and chairs it is suitable for smaller meetings and groups.

The sprung hall floor has been revarnished and new curtains purchased and hung. The main hall is marked out for badminton and a badminton group meet every Monday evening at 7:30pm.
