Parking vehicles on verges causes damage, which is unsightly, can create hazards for the visually impaired, disabled and elderly people or those who may wish to cross over the verge. Such damage is very costly to repair.

In addition, parking on the verge can also damage underground services which could create danger and inconvenience to residents and pedestrians

In certain circumstances, inconsiderate parking can be an offence which could incur a court fine.

Please be a responsible vehicle owner and where possible park your vehicle in a garage or within the curtilage of your own property. Any routine maintenance required at the Mere will be carried out during the winter months. Please take care around the area of Coppergate. Ducks may be sleeping on the highway. If you notice any items of pollution in the Mere, please contact Yorkshire Water or the Parish Council immediately.
