New Community Orchard Takes Root in Nafferton

The 3rd March 2025 marked a fruitful new beginning in Nafferton, as volunteers and nature enthusiasts gathered in Nethergate to plant the first trees of the newly established Nafferton Orchard.

Situated on land leased from the Nafferton Feoffee Trust, the orchard has been created for the benefit of the wider community. The initial planting saw a variety of fruit trees introduced to the site, with the long-term goal of creating a vibrant, living space that supports both biodiversity and community engagement.

But the orchard is about more than just fruit — it's about cultivating connection. The space will be used to host talks on nature, sustainability, and the environment, as well as events that bring people together to learn and enjoy the outdoors.

To help raise funds for the orchard's development and ongoing activities, organisers are hosting a **Village Treasure Hunt on 30th August**, inviting families, friends, and curious minds to explore Nafferton in a fun and interactive way. The hunt will take participants through various points of interest around the village, finishing at the orchard, where refreshments and a warm welcome will await. Maps for £1 are available from Liz Martin, 3 Walnut Close, Nafferton from the beginning of August.

"We want this to be something the whole community can be proud of," said one of the organisers. "The treasure hunt is not just a fundraiser — it's a celebration of what we're building together."

As the trees begin to take root, so too does the vision for a greener, more connected Nafferton — one tree, and one event, at a time.

Church future: A meeting in Wansford Village Hall on 22 May regarding the future of Wansford Church was largely positive with those present, many from outside the village, anxious to see the church and particularly the church yard remain open. Subsequently two new members joined the three-strong parochial church council and cash donations totalling £2,480 were made. Additionally, four villagers took out a standing order bringing the church's regular income by this method up from £75 to £165 a month.

The PCC thanks everyone who attended and all who have shown their support in any way since the meeting – they know who they are.

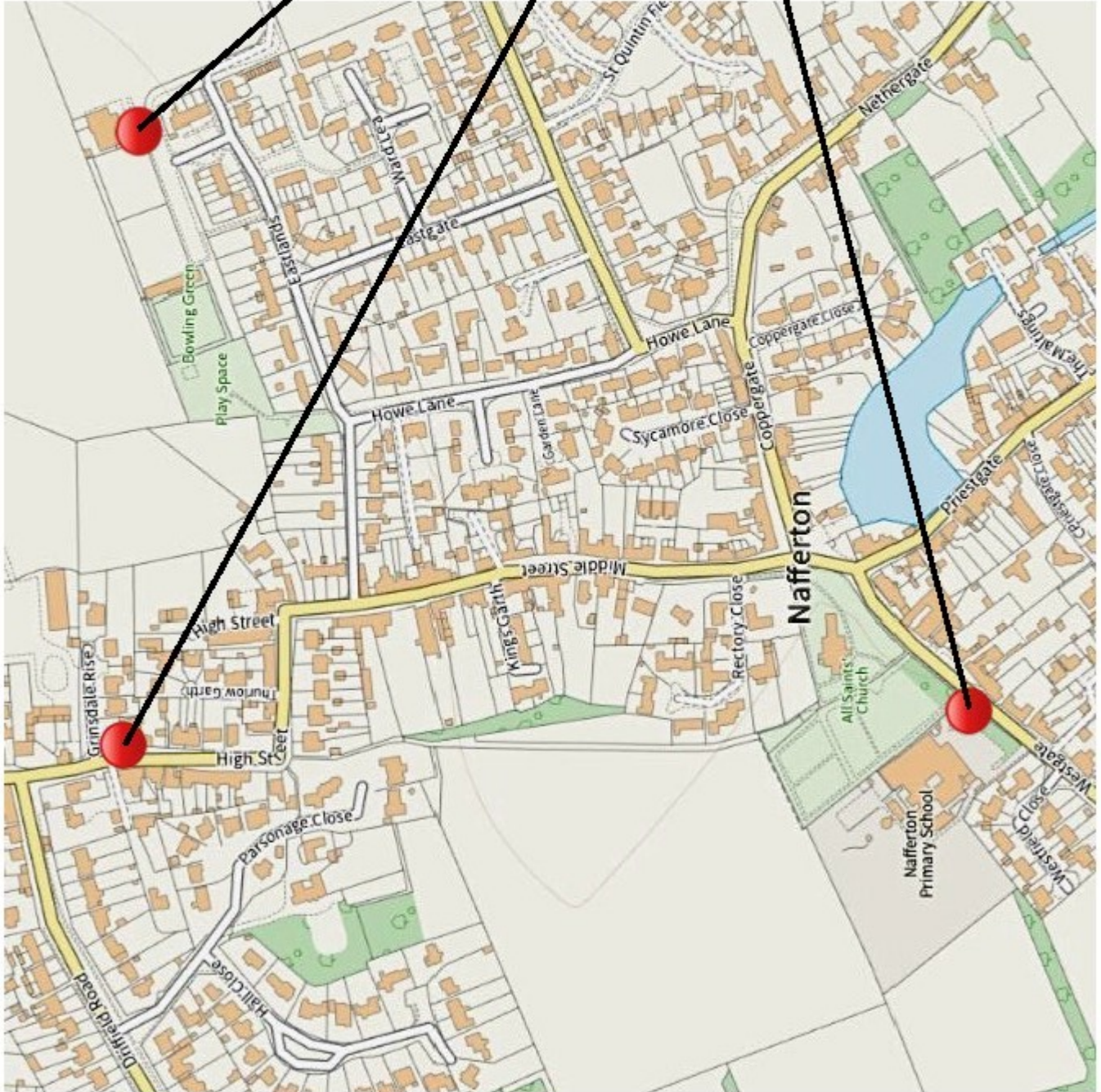

Pavement Parking

When cars are parked on pavements, people with a vision impairment may have to risk their lives by walking into the road just to get by them. This is an issue that also impacts parents with prams, wheelchair users, older people and many others.

Pavement parking is consistently highlighted as one of the key challenges people with sight loss face; 81% of people with sight loss said that reducing obstacles on pavements and street clutter was important to improving their quality of life.

Our research has also found that four out of five blind or partially sighted people said that pavement parking makes it difficult to walk on the pavement at least once a week.
